The treasurer pays all bills in a timely manner, provides monthly reports of financial activity to Council and to respective committees, quarterly reports to the voters, assists with the development of the budget, and oversees tax documentation for St. Paul's and workers.

The financial secretary oversees the counting, the counters, and the deposits of all financial contributions to the congregation. This person is responsible for submitting a report to the treasurer, and reporting these weekly to the congregation.

Council Meeting Minutes
November 6, 2019**

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Todd Marten. Pastor Bode opened the meeting with devotion and prayer.

The Secretary's minutes from the October Council meeting were reviewed. A Motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the minutes as presented.

A motion was made seconded, and carried to approve all membership action.

Reports:

Pastor Report – Pastor Mueller reported that October was a very busy month with 2 weddings, 3 funerals, Urban Artique Event hosted by the Stewardship Committee, canvassing with the Evangelism Committee, and providing counseling as needed. In addition, speakers and narrators were lined up to record the Living Nativity story. Luther Curia and Phil Meyer are working together to edit and finalize the new recording.

Pastor Bode has resumed family visits. The Mindful Moms group is exploring the possibility of a “Jesus Loves Me” event in February. The event will be a spin-off on Valentine’s Day. Pastor Bode noted that the number of non-members joining the Mindful Moms group is growing. The Pioneers Group held a fire safety training event in October and a culinary night in November. Special thanks to Gale Litt for leading the culinary event. The planning for the Christmas and New Year’s services are on track. Christmas at St. Paul’s is set for December 15th at 9:00 a.m. Pastor continues to work to refresh the Greeters’ program. The Greeter’s program is looking for a volunteer to step into the role of coordinator. Anyone interested in coordinating this program should contact Pastor Bode.



Elders Report – The Elders and Pastors continue to reach out to delinquent members. The Elders were asked to consider incorporating a children's devotion time into the Sunday worship service. Pastor Bode prepared a document outlining various positives and challenges to incorporating this element into our service. After a review and discussion of these items, it was decided to not pursue incorporating this into our worship service at this time. The subject will be revisited in a year.

Principal's Report – Mr. Marohn and Mrs. Mueller recently visited Grafton High School to tour their Science wing. Grafton recently remodeled their facilities and the tour provided ideas for our possible future Science room. The teachers recently attended the State Teacher's Conference in late October.

Approximately 80 grandparents visited for the Grandparents' Day event. The event continues to grow and garner positive feedback. The Veterans' Day Dinner is scheduled for November 11th and about 25 veterans are expected to attend. The school successfully held lock-down drills in October. The school leaders continue to evaluate and work to improve school safety and emergency response preparation.

The accreditation audit remains scheduled for January 19th through the 22nd. We are in the process of moving our accreditation self-study and evidence over to our digital presentation format. The visiting audit team will use this to view and evaluate the self-study.

Mr. Marohn continues to investigate the Special Needs Scholarship Program and how it might service our students and school. The deadline for entering the program is March 1st.

Board of Education – The BCE reviewed the school's Public Relations Strategy, Outreach and Inreach Plans. No changes have been made to the plans. As stated in the Principal's report, a great deal of time and energy has been dedicated to studying the possibility of entering the Special Needs Scholarship Program (SNSP). The BCE has voted to pursue this program and the deadline to enter the program is March 1, 2020. Mr. Marohn and Mr. Radue presented the proposal and plan for the SNSP to the council. The SNSP will carry additional costs for additional staffing to serve the students. It is likely that much of this cost will be offset by the funding provided through the program. Staffing changes will be required to meet the needs of this program. Staffing changes are still being reviewed.

Treasurer's Report – October offerings for 4 Sundays were lower than September which had 5 Sundays. However, year-to-date offerings are only slightly below budget. Several individual expense accounts are over budget and are being reviewed. However, the overall expenses for church and school are under budget. Property expenses are over budget due to an HVAC invoice in which the work was performed in March but the bill was not received until July. WELS and MLHS commitments continue to be paid monthly as budgeted. The total financial results show a year-to-date loss of \$23,700 compared to a budgeted loss of \$62,000. Total bank balances as of 10/31/19 are \$48,835. The mortgage and member loans total \$937,600. The annual financial audit is complete and the results showed finances to be in good order. The required financial reports were filed with the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction in timely fashion on October 15, 2019. One audit finding is that our audit firm of Clifton, Larson, Allen also provides payroll services for St. Paul's. This is deemed to be a conflict of interest by the Wisconsin DPI. To avoid any issues with the DPI a new payroll processing firm will be sought.

Trustee's Report – John Marten reported the Trustees are reviewing the cost of rekeying the 8 outside door locks. Terry Roehrborn is checking with La Force Company if we can replace the lock cores rather than the entire lock. Tim Doro has offered to replace the bottom board on the school siding with a material that does not deteriorate like the present cement board. It would require cutting out the bad board and replacing it with the new material. Dean's Electric has the light control manual to study before coming to explain the system to the trustees. Dean's will also look at the outside lights that shine on the church windows. We are going to check on LED bulbs and new time clock or controls for those lights.



Evangelism Report – The committee continues to review the results of the New Mover Mailer program and the results from the previous month's canvassing efforts. The data provided through the program appears to be highly accurate and usable. It has been decided to continue the strategy of utilizing door-to-door visits.

Following discussion of the effectiveness of the Great Exchange it was determined that it would not be continued going forward and those resources will be utilized on door-to-door canvassing.

The next two meetings will be held in November and used to canvas to spread information about the Living Nativity and our church and school events. No meeting will be held in December.

Stewardship Report – The Urban Artique event was a fun-filled success with 24 in attendance. A sheephead and cribbage day will be held on Sunday, November 17th.

Officer's Report – We have received a quote from CRW Insurance for the health, life, and LTD coverage for our employees. Our current provider, Vizance is still more competitive and we have been advised to stay with our current coverage. Mike Leahy has begun researching phone systems with the end goal to be to replace the current system which is outdated.

WELS – The fall Conference of Presidents meeting was held in early October with numerous items of importance discussed and acted upon.

1. A report was given by a special committee appointed two years ago on how to improve the WELS pension plan for called workers. In November, the Synodical Council meeting will review the recommendations and possible adoption.
2. The Council of Presidents adopted a document titled "Human sexuality, Personhood, Identity and the Historic Christian Faith: A Confession on Human Sexuality. The document will address the current controversy and unbiblical views of the transgender issue. Documents are being developed and will be available for pastors to help them address this issue within their congregations.
3. Another issue reviewed was a restatement of our WELS doctrinal position on the God-given role of men and women. The document titled "Male and Female in God's Word" does not change our position but is intended to clarify and expand some aspects that have not been fully addressed in the present WELS doctrinal statement. Support material is also being developed for pastors and teachers to be used at the congregational level.

Members are encouraged to visit the WELS website regularly to learn more about these and other topics.

MLHS – Karen Wilsman will be retiring and Natasha Cole will be resigning at the end of the year. Joe Jahnke is currently holding a call to Wisconsin Lutheran. It is likely that we will be looking to call a Director of Mission Advancement in the future also.

The Federation Delegate Meeting will be held on 11/9 at 9:00 a.m. Calls for three positions will be placed. The positions are to teach English, Music with a band emphasis, and Curriculum Coordinator/Resource Center.

A special committee has finished reviewing the MLHS constitution and the Board of Control will consider next steps to take regarding the recommended changes.

The proposed budget has been approved by the Board and will be presented to the delegates on 11/9 for approval.

Old Business - No old business was discussed at this time.

New Business - The Council has approved the creation of a fund to hold contributions designated for a possible building project to add on to the school. This fund is being created in response to the approval given to the Long Range Planning Committee to study the possibility of adding a 3K program.

It has been brought to the attention of the trustees that the folding chairs are showing signs of wear and it would be the right time to consider purchasing some new folding chairs. The trustees have proposed the purchase of 64 folding chairs with padded seats and one chair rack. The approximate cost is \$2000. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to approve this purchase with funds from the Memorial Fund.

The nominating committee will soon meet to begin addressing the positions which will be up for reelection in 2020.

Being no other business, a motion was made and carried to adjourn. The meeting closed with prayer.

October 16, 2019**

Pastor Bode led a devotion based on Psalm 90 and encouraged the board to sing for joy and be glad every-day.

Pastor's Report: delivered by Pastor Bode

Principal's Report:

- A low and high priority drill are going to be conducted also including an evacuation exercise.
- Parent teacher conferences scheduled.
- Veterans day activities are planned.
- November 12th the Board will hold an open forum at the PTF meeting.
- All of the work for the security grant has been completed.

Old Business: Special Needs Scholarship Program, Mrs. Belitz has agreed to help with the program if St. Paul's decides to pursue it. The school would need to enter the program by March 1st. The board decided to present information on this to the Church Council.

Mr. Marohn spent time breaking down the Action Plan that was approved by the voters. Mr. Marohn presented the board with some possibilities on future staffing options. The staffing needs of St. Paul's will be changing to accommodate the action plan and there are some advantages to moving things forward sooner. It could be beneficial to the 21-22 school year to accelerate things stated in the action plan. A discussion was held on how to get information from parents and congregation members on how financial support is given to the school. An open forum could be held to gather information from everyone on how tuition needs to be decided. Currently the school is funded over 80% by the congregation and as the cost per student goes up, tuition needs to be considered.

New Business: Annual review of the school's Public Relation Strategy, Outreach Plan and Inreach Plan, no changes were made.

Mr Marohn updated the board on the Lakeshore Lutheran Principals Conference. The conference suggested creating a called worker position to work at MLHS 1/2 teacher and 1/2 Curriculum Coordinator. This position would assist all schools in the federation in adapting curriculum and having the Pre K-8 program align itself with MLHS's 9-12 program.

The board sees this as a very beneficial program for St. Paul's. It was recommended to give MLHS our approval to move forward.

Pastor Bode closed the meeting with prayer.

Eugene A. Kuether

Born April 9, 1927; Died June 6, 2019

Eugene was born in Smiths Mill, MN, the son of Rev. Herman and Elenora Kuether. Gene moved to Wisconsin when he was two years old when his father was called to serve as pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran Church.

Gene enlisted in the U.S. Navy at age 18 and volunteered for SeaBee Duty.

On February 3, 1951 he married Connie Hierseman at St. Paul's. They lived in the Howards Grove area before moving to Manitowoc County where they lived with their son Dan on the farm. In his younger years, he enjoyed fishing with his good friend, Butch Bitter and hunting with his hunting buddies and his son and grandsons.

He worked as an apprentice plumber at Bitter Neumann Plumbing in Millersville. After receiving his Journeyman's license, he worked for Silvis Plumbing in Sheboygan. In 1954 he went to work for TenPas Plumbing and retired from there in 1990. During that time he received his Master Plumber license. After retirement he enjoyed helping on the farm.

The funeral text for Eugene's funeral on June 10, 2019 was Hebrews 13:7-8. Hymns sung during the service were "How Great Thou Art", "I Know That my Redeemer Lives" and "Amazing Grace."

Arline Hoppe



Arline Hoppe was born January 17, 1928 in Millersville. Her parents were Arvin and Lydia Sprenger. They lived in a house near the Millersville Box Company, one of the oldest houses in Millersville. She had one brother, Lester, and two sisters, Irene Sebald and Bernice Thompson. She attended Millersville grade school and Sheboygan Central High School. There were no buses, so she and Jim Doro rode to high school with Elmer Kueter who worked in Sheboygan.

After graduating in 1945, Arline worked until 1950 at Commercial Engraving Co, upstairs in the Sheboygan Press building. On November 1, 1947 she and Reuben Hoppe were married. They were married for 70 years until his death. They were blessed with two children, Sandra Strauss and David, who are members of St. Paul's, and three grandchildren. Reuben and Arline went fishing together and enjoyed bowling. She was an officer of the bowling league.

She sang in the choir, was a member of Ladies Aid in which she has held every office, and serves on the history committee. She has prepared many binders and scrapbooks of church history and donated her collection of Forward in Christ magazines to WELS archives. As a member of the Millersville Research Committee, she helped to write and compile the book Millersville Wisconsin, which was published by Sheboygan County Historical Society in 2007.

Arline and Reuben were also active in the community. Reuben was the first village clerk of Howards Grove in 1967; Arline was deputy clerk. Later she became the clerk when Reuben left the position. She went to H.C. Mueller Co. in Milwaukee to get the appropriate record books for the village.

Arline says the new church building has more room and is more convenient than the former church. Her favorite Bible verse is "If God be for us, who can be against us?" Romans 8:31. Favorite hymns are Just As I Am and Abide With Me.

Norbert (Pete) Prange
Born August 31, 1926

Norbert (Pete) Prange was born on August 31, 1926 in Howards Grove to Adolph and Bertha Prange. He was the youngest of five children, having two older brothers and two older sisters. He is the last surviving member, with all of his siblings having lived to the ages of 89-93, except for a sister who died at 62.

Mr. Prange had a happy childhood, but he still remembers the difficulty of growing up during the Great Depression, and how the family survived on food provided by a few farm animals. Growing up, his parents instilled in him a strong work ethic and the importance of faith. In school, he enjoyed all subjects (with the exception of math) and was a good athlete - playing baseball, basketball, and flag football.

After graduation, Mr. Prange enlisted in the Army, doing his basic training in Alabama and serving in the Philippine Islands during WWII, which was an eye-opening experience. Mr. Prange has a good sense of humor and likes to joke that when Japan discovered that he was slated for the invasion of Japan, the country surrendered.

After two years of service, Mr. Prange considered re-enlisting, but felt he was needed more at home, and so he returned to Howards Grove in 1947 to assist his parents. He followed in his father's footsteps to the Vollrath Company, where he worked for 20 years. From there, he became an insurance agent with American Family for 25 years, which afforded him the opportunity to travel.

Mr. Prange met his future wife, Marion Herzog, at a friend's wedding and they were married in 1950. He promised his new bride that she would never have to work outside the home, and it was a promise he kept. They briefly lived in Sheboygan for 6 months after they were married, and it was the only time other than his service in the Army that he lived outside of Howards Grove.

The Pranges built a house in Howards Grove in 1958, with Norbert doing a fair amount of the work himself. They had a wonderful marriage and were blessed with four children (John, Tom, Bob, and Sandra), seven grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren. They were married for 51 years before Marion passed away in 2001. Mr. Prange still lives in the house, which holds many happy memories for him.

His children still live in the area, and Sandra and her daughter Elizabeth are also members of St. Paul's. The family is able to gather for special occasions, including the recent celebration of his 93rd birthday at the Log Cabin restaurant. He marvels at today's technology, which allowed one of his son's friends to wish him a happy birthday from Germany via Facebook.

Mr. Prange belongs to the Athletic Club and the VFW, where he's been a member for 71 years. In the past, he enjoyed gardening and furniture making, and he hasn't lost his love of sports. He plays golf every week in the warmer weather, and roots for the Packers, Brewers, and Bucks.

Mr. Prange is the oldest living life-long member of St. Paul's to be baptized at the church, and he was also confirmed and married there. Throughout his life, he has been active at St. Paul's, having served as usher, Sunday school teacher, financial officer, and president of the congregation during the time the church built the parsonage.

Mr. Prange still loves going to church and bible study, rarely missing a Sunday. His faith has been particularly comforting in his later years as he copes with numerous health issues and the loss of loved ones. Although he has too many treasured Bible passages to pick a favorite, his favorite hymn is "How Great Thou Art." He is thankful that St. Paul's has been richly blessed with two wonderful pastors and many talented musicians who make the services so beautiful. And clearly, Mr. Prange has been a blessing to St. Paul's.
