We offer Communion on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month as well as those following Monday evenings. ## FAMILIES WITH SMALL CHILDREN



- 1. Did You Know?** 2022 marks the 160th anniversary of our St. Paul's congregation! In commemoration of this memorable milestone for our church, we will be sharing interesting facts about our church's history in each week's bulletin until a special anniversary service in fall. In 1902 the first renovation of the 1884 church building was completed, which included the installation of stained glass windows. When our current sanctuary was built in 2002/2003 these windows were carefully transferred to the new building. If you look closely at the windows in the front of church you will see "Von den Frauen" and "Von den Jungen". These windows were "from the women" and "from the young". Read more about the history of our beautiful stained glass windows in the church library.
- 2. Joint Ascension Service** - On May 26 at 6:30 pm, there will be a joint Ascension service for St. Paul's (Howards Grove), Calvary (Sheboygan), and St. John's / St. Peter's (Cleveland). The service will be hosted by SJSP in Cleveland (1251 W.

Washington Ave). **Children from the Sunday Schools and Day School will be singing an anthem and will meet at SJSP at 6:00 to put the song together.**

The offering gathered at the service will go toward the WELS Home Mission effort of 100 missions in 10 years. All are welcome to stay after the service for ice cream and fellowship.

3. **SAVE THE DATE** - St. Paul's will celebrate its 160th anniversary on September 18th in both Sunday services. We have lined up Rev. Tom Unke (our former pastor) to preach that day. More details to come!
4. **New Sunday Bible Study** - Beginning today after the Call meeting, we will have a new Sunday morning Bible study entitled "The Seven Letters to the Seven Churches". In the book of Revelation, John received messages from God for seven churches that existed in his day.
