COMMUNION

We offer Communion on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month as well as those following Monday evenings. Because God says that Communion is an expression of unity (1 Cor.10:16-17), we practice close communion, inviting up to the Lord's Table those who have explored and established unity with us on the basis of God's Word. Please speak to a pastor if you have questions about our practice.

FAMILIES WITH SMALL CHILDREN

- 1. Did You Know?** 2022 marks the 160th anniversary of our St. Paul’s congregation! In commemoration of this memorable milestone for our church, we will be sharing interesting facts about our church’s history in each week’s bulletin until a special anniversary service in fall. In 1903 a marble Baptismal font was dedicated. This font, now almost 120 years old, can be found in the church narthex (entryway to the sanctuary). What a wonderful piece of St. Paul’s history! We find great comfort in Baptism because Baptism is God’s work for us. Paul wrote that we are clothed with Christ through Baptism and made children of our heavenly Father (Galatians 3:26,27). We are also connected to Christ’s death and resurrection (Romans 6:3,4). Everything Christ won through his death and resurrection is given to us—personally, individually—through our baptism.
- 2. SAVE THE DATE** - St. Paul’s will celebrate its 160th anniversary on September 18th in both Sunday services. We have lined up Rev. Tom Unke (our former pastor) to preach that day. More details to come!
- 3. New Sunday Bible Study** - Sunday morning Bible study is entitled “The Seven Letters to the Seven Churches”. In the book of Revelation, John received messages from God for seven churches that existed in his day. These were real churches, each facing challenges that threatened their existence and effectiveness. The focus of this study is to understand each church’s context of ministry, the challenges faced by that church, and the instructions given to that church. We will be challenged to look for

ways the lessons learned from these churches can be applied to St. Paul's. *This study is for the whole family.*

4. **Call Meeting** - At the call meeting last week our congregation extended renewed calls to Mrs. Ann Marohn at the 4K level and Mr. Greg Johnson as part time Vice Principal. These calls by design are renewed every year. We were not able to extend a call for Principal administrative relief at this time.
5. **8th Grade Graduation** - We were blessed to celebrate the graduation of five 8th graders in our late service last weekend: Trinity Curia, Kyle Heilman, Addison Meyer, Victoria Perl, and Joel Voigt. May the Lord keep them in his grace in the years to come!
6. **A Generous Grant** by a local business [The Petrol Center] gave us nearly \$7,000 to fund a robotics curriculum & supplies for our school from Kindergarten through 5th grades!
