BIBLE STUDY OPPORTUNITIES

Join us after first service, at 9:15 a.m., for our Family Bible Hour. We have Sunday school for 4K-8th grade and Adult Bible Class. Childcare is offered during the Adult Bible Class. There are other Bible Study Opportunities during the week. Contact one of our Pastors for more information.

COMMUNION

We offer Communion on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month as well as those following Monday evenings. Because God says that Communion is an expression of unity (1 Cor.10:16-17), we practice close communion, inviting up to the Lord's Table those who have explored and established unity with us on the basis of God's Word. Please speak to a pastor if you have questions about our practice.

FAMILIES WITH SMALL CHILDREN

There are changing tables located in BOTH the women's and men's school bathrooms. Near the entrance of the church, there are children's quiet bags with pictures, books, and a sketch tablet. If you use them, please put them back after the service. Based on Scriptural examples and developmental evidence, parents at St. Paul's worship with their young children. We encourage members to reserve the back few pews for families with small children. We have a nursery room located just off the narthex. There is a speaker in there so you can still hear and take part in the worship service. Please feel free to use this room for your child(ren), including a place to nurse.



St. Paul's Lutheran Church is a member of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (The WELS) and was founded in 1862. We have our Lutheran elementary school (4K-grade 8) on site and are part of a federation of churches to support our own high school, Manitowoc Lutheran High School.

Today's Worship Focus: *Last weekend, we celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit, who works faith in our hearts. Just who is the God that he leads us to trust? The Spirit-inspired Scriptures teach that there is only one true God who is three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Christians over time have come to refer to him as the Triune (three-in-one) God. Today we celebrate Blessings from our God, the only true God, our Triune God.*

Communion Preparation: *Christian Questions to prepare our hearts for communion are found on pp. 295-296 in the hymnal. Prayer: Lord Jesus, you have invited me to come and receive your holy Sacrament. I believe that in the bread and wine you give me your true body and blood to eat and drink. Forgive my sins and nourish my faith through this precious meal. I long for the comfort that comes with your promises; I yearn for the assurance of your faithful love. Bless me now as I receive you by faith. Amen.*







Romans 5

ATHANASIAN CREED PART 1

This statement of belief, together with the Apostles' and Nicene creeds, is held in common by all Christian churches. It was written to take a stand on God's Word against false teachings about the triune God and the person of Jesus Christ. Although it was not written by Athanasius, it is named after this defender of God's truth who lived in the 300s AD. We humans cannot comprehend the fullness of God. But since he is our Lord and Savior and means everything to us, we honor his name and what he tells us about himself in the Scriptures.

Whoever wishes to be saved must, above all else, hold to the true Christian faith. Whoever does not keep this faith pure in all points will certainly perish forever. Now this is the true Christian faith:

We worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity, without mixing the persons or dividing the divine being. For each person—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—is distinct, but the deity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory and coeternal in majesty. What the Father is, so is the Son, and so is the Holy Spirit. The Father is uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated; the Father is infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite; the Father is eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal; yet they are not three who are eternal, but there is one who is eternal, just as they are not three who are uncreated, nor three who are infinite, but there is one who is uncreated and one who is infinite.

In the same way the Father is almighty, the Son is almighty, the Holy Spirit is almighty; yet they are not three who are almighty, but there is one who is almighty. So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God; yet they are not three Gods, but one God. So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord; yet they are not three Lords, but one Lord. For just as Christian truth compels us to confess each person individually to be God and Lord, so the true Christian faith forbids us to speak of three Gods or three Lords.

The Father is neither made nor created nor begotten of anyone. The Son is neither made nor created, but is begotten of the Father alone. The Holy Spirit is neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeds from the Father and the Son. So there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits. And within this Trinity none comes before or after; none is greater or inferior; but all three persons are coequal and coeternal, so that in every way, as stated before, the Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity is to be worshiped.

Whoever wishes to be saved must have this conviction of the Trinity.

1. **Did You Know?** 2022 marks the 160th anniversary of our St. Paul’s congregation! In commemoration of this memorable milestone for our church, we will be sharing interesting facts about our church’s history in each week’s bulletin until a special anniversary service in fall. In 1952 the church building underwent a complete renovation and redecorating at a cost of \$40,000. A basement was dug to provide a kitchen and meeting rooms. New pews, organ, light fixtures, carpeting, and heating system were also installed.
2. **SAVE THE DATE** - St. Paul’s will celebrate its 160th anniversary on September 18th in both Sunday services. We have lined up Rev. Tom Unke (our former pastor) to preach that day. More details to come!
3. **Sunday Bible Study** - Sunday morning Bible study is entitled “The Seven Letters to the Seven Churches”. In the book of Revelation, John received messages from God for seven churches that existed in his day. These were real churches, each facing challenges that threatened their existence and effectiveness. The focus of this study is to understand each church’s context of ministry, the challenges faced by that church, and the instructions given to that church. We will be challenged to look for ways the lessons learned from these churches can be applied to St. Paul’s. *This study is for the whole family.*
4. **Sunday Morning Child Care** is offered in the preschool room during Family Bible Hour. Since the summer Bible class is geared for adults all the way down to about 3rd graders, children younger than that can be brought to child care during that time.
5. **Men’s Crafts-Men Bible Study Thursday** - Join us Thursday @ 6:30. We will study the life of Gideon. Greatness is a highly elusive thing. Many people pursue it, some run from it, others don’t care. There are times, however, when greatness comes knocking on your door, totally unexpected. Such is the case with Gideon. He wanted to remain obscure and far from the limelight, yet God had other plans for him. By all appearances, Gideon was somewhat of a wimp, but God saw something else. Bring along a beverage of choice. Snacks will be served. There's always a great deal of discussion and real-life application of the Word of God.
6. **Pastor Bode Divine Call Received** - Pastor Bode has received a call to help start a mission congregation in Windsor, CO together with 12 members of a core group made up from WELS churches in that surrounding area. He welcomes your prayers and input

in the coming weeks as he considers where he can best serve the Lord in the years to come.

7. **Northern Wisconsin District (NWD) Convention** - On June 14-15, our male called workers and a congregational delegate, Ed Strauss, will attend the convention of our district of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS). The theme is “Words of Eternal Life”, marking the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther’s translation of the New Testament into German. We will have worship services, hear presentations on Congregational Culture and Authentic Christian Presence, so that we can consider how Jesus’ words of eternal life shape our congregations and how we can communicate those words to souls around us in the 21st century. There will be updates on the work that our district and synod cooperate on, such as called worker training, missions, and ministry to those in prison or with special needs. There will also be elections for people to serve on various committees.
8. **Transportation Event** - St Paul's Early Childhood program would love for you to join us for an event on June 18th, 2022 from 10:00 am - noon. There will be a Bible message, play dough, music, snacks, indoor activities and crafts, outdoor activities like bikes, little car washes, paint, and sensory play. All activities will be geared toward children ages 0-5, all activities are theme based - all about transportation. Bring the family or a caregiver or two and watch your children play and have fun. Register through our website to aid in planning for the event. Please come and invite your neighbors as well!
9. **St. Paul's Lutheran School is excited to be starting** a Robotics program beginning in 2022-2023. We recently received a \$6,800 grant from Petro Center to help us with our initial start-up. Our K-8 Robotics curriculum is supported by VEX Robotics. Students begin by learning the sequence, logic, and problem solving of coding. As they progress through the curriculum, they learn to construct highly functioning robots and learn how to program movements. We are excited to launch this program next year through our FLEX periods. We are looking forward to building on the program as we continue to strengthen our STEM curriculum.
10. **LUTHER PREP SUMMER CAMPS** LPS Summer Camps are in FULL planning mode and we hope to see more of your children join us! We offer Day Camps & Overnight Camps for a variety of sports **AND** for the 2nd year in a row our **new** Phoenix Adventure Camp! 11. **July 22 Summer Party:** The Activities Committee is hosting a special event Friday, July 22 from 5:00-8:00 p.m. There will be food trucks, trivia, and an outdoor

12. **The St. Paul's Car Show:** will take place August 13 this summer. The Show will run from 9-2. Besides all the awesome cars to take a look at, there will be a mingling magician from 10:00-12:00 (www.idealmagic52.com). Musician Andy Braun (www.andybraun.com) will perform favorites from CCR, the Beatles, and other folk-rock favorites from 12:00-2:00. There will also be a bounce house for the kids. We are looking at having various classes for cars and trucks and one for motorcycles. *Registration will be out soon.* More info to come. Mark your calendar!
