

Join us after first service, at 9:15 a.m., for our Family Bible Hour. We have Sunday school for 4K-8th grade and Adult Bible Class. Childcare is offered during the Adult Bible Class. There are other Bible Study Opportunities during the week. Contact one of our Pastors for more information.

## COMMUNION

We offer Communion on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month as well as those following Monday evenings. Because God says that Communion is an expression of unity (1 Cor.10:16-17), we practice close communion, inviting up to the Lord's Table those who have explored and established unity with us on the basis of God's Word. Please speak to a pastor if you have questions about our practice.

## FAMILIES WITH SMALL CHILDREN

There are changing tables located in BOTH the women's and men's school bathrooms. Near the entrance of the church, there are children's quiet bags with pictures, books, and a sketch tablet. If you use them, please put them back after the service. Based on Scriptural examples and developmental evidence, parents at St. Paul's worship with their young children. We encourage members to reserve the back few pews for families with small children. We have a nursery room located just off the narthex. There is a speaker in there so you can still hear and take part in the worship service. Please feel free to use this room for your child(ren), including a place to nurse.



St. Paul's Lutheran Church is a member of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (The WELS) and was founded in 1862. We have our Lutheran elementary school (4K-grade 8) on site and are part of a federation of churches to support our own high school, Manitowoc Lutheran High School.







- 1. Did You Know?** 2022 marks the 160th anniversary of our St. Paul's congregation! In commemoration of this memorable milestone for our church, we will be sharing interesting facts about our church's history in each week's bulletin until a special anniversary service in fall. In 1917 a new 3-level, 30x48 ft schoolhouse was built. The first floor was a classroom. The second floor was a meeting hall with a stage and coatroom. The classroom was used for Bible History and Catechism classes. For four weeks each June children in grades 1-8 would meet in the classroom for reading and writing lessons in German. Learn more about our St. Paul's history by viewing the displays in the church library.
- 2. SAVE THE DATE** - St. Paul's will celebrate its 160th anniversary on September 18th in both Sunday services. We have lined up Rev. Tom Unke (our former pastor) to preach that day. More details to come!
- 3. Sunday Bible Study** - Sunday morning Bible study is entitled "The Seven Letters to the Seven Churches". In the book of Revelation, John received messages from God for seven churches that existed in his day. These were real

churches, each facing challenges that threatened their existence and effectiveness. The focus of this study is to understand each church's context of ministry, the challenges faced by that church, and the instructions given to that church. We will be challenged to look for ways the lessons learned from these churches can be applied to St. Paul's. *This study is for the whole family.*

4. **Sunday Morning Child Care** is offered in the preschool room during Family Bible Hour. Since the summer Bible class is geared for adults all the way down to about 3rd graders, children younger than that can be brought to child care during that time.
5. **Men's Crafts-Men Bible Study** - Mark your calendars for the next class: Thursday, July 21 @ 6:30 p.m.
6. **Pastor Bode Divine Call Received** - On June 5, Pastor Bode has received a call to help start a mission congregation in Windsor, CO together with 12 members of a core group made up from WELS churches in that surrounding area. He welcomes your prayers and input as he considers where he can best serve the Lord in the years to come.
7. **Transportation Event** - St Paul's Early Childhood program would love for you to join us for an event on June 18th, 2022 from 10:00 am - noon. There will be a Bible message, play dough, music, snacks, indoor activities and crafts, outdoor activities like bikes, little car washes, paint, and sensory play. All activities will be geared toward children ages 0-5, all activities are theme based - all about transportation. Bring the family or a caregiver or two and watch your children play and have fun. Register through our website to aid in planning for the event. Please come and invite your neighbors as well!
8. **A Joint Handbell Choir** is being formed this fall with members of St. Paul's and Calvary, Sheboygan. 7th graders through adults are welcome. Ringing experience is helpful but not required.
