

COMMUNION

St. Paul's Lutheran Church is a member of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (The WELS) and was founded in 1862. We have our Lutheran elementary school (4K-grade 8) on site and are part of a federation of churches to support our own high school, Manitowoc Lutheran High School.

- ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION** - St. Paul's celebrate its 160th anniversary this weekend in both Sunday services. We wish to thank Pastor Unke for being with us, as well as all the volunteers behind the scenes who worked to make this event so special. Join us in the gym for a light breakfast and peruse historical displays. Dick Stoelb will also give a brief presentation on the history of St. Paul's. After the late service, we will enjoy a picnic (food provided by Three Guys and a Grill). There is no cost for the meal, but a free-will offering will be collected to defray the costs.
- Sunday Bible Study:** In place of Bible study today, there will be a brief presentation on our congregation's history in the gym. On September 25, we will begin a new unit on the Divine Call.
- Sunday School** - The theme for Sunday School this year is "Built on the Rock". Classes began last Sunday between services. Parents, if you haven't already, please register your children by using the link on our website, stpaulshowardsgrove.org, or fill out a paper registration in the school hallway. Printed informational pamphlets are available as well. May the Lord richly bless this ministry!
- Child Care** - Since there is no Bible class today, child care will not be offered. It will resume on September 25 between services.
- There will be NO Monday evening worship** on September 19th due to the anniversary celebration on Sunday the 18th.
- World Religions Study** - Join Staff Minister Luther Curia Tuesday evenings at 6:30 beginning September 6 as we examine the basic teachings of Christianity and compare them to the teachings of other world religions. This course will establish basic patterns that flow through all non-Christian religions. With this basic understanding as a foundation, class members will

focus on four non-Christian religions: Judaism, Islam, Buddhism, and Hinduism. These four were chosen because of the greater likelihood of class members meeting and having the opportunity to witness to people of these religions. Application exercises are weighted with questions about the Jewish and Muslim religions as most North American Christians have the most contact with non-Christians from these religions.

7. **Contented Parenting Bible Study** - As a parent, do you ever wish you could just stop worrying and fixating on things you can't control? Jesus gave us the key, and it all has to do with our focus. When our focus is on the world, worry is usually the result, but when we focus on Christ . . . well, that changes everything. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus called us to seek his kingdom and his righteousness first. After that, everything else falls into place. The School Board will be giving an update on current enrollment numbers, as well as projected enrollment for upcoming years. In conjunction with this update, they will be sharing rationale for the need to call a 2nd grade teacher so that the current 1st/2nd grade classroom can be split due to the expected larger enrollment in 2023. Mrs. Johnson would continue to teach 1st grade. This open forum will take place during the Bible study hour. The second date to make note of is the fall voters meeting, which is scheduled for Sunday, October 16th, following the late church service. The main item on the agenda for this meeting will be to seek approval from the voters to call for a 3k teacher, as well as a 1st or 2nd grade teacher for the start of the 2023 school year. If the voters approve to call for one, or both of these positions, we are planning to place calls at the end of the meeting.
