St. Paul's Lutheran Church is a member of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (The WELS) and was founded in 1862. We have our Lutheran elementary school (4K-grade 8) on site and are part of a federation of churches to support our own high school, Manitowoc Lutheran High School.

Whether you wear glasses, use contacts or have 20-20 vision, we were actually all born with a vision problem and we didn't know it. 





Gospel

John 9:1-7, 13-17, 34-39

Jesus opened the eyes of the man born blind and led that man to trust him as the Son of Man, the Lord.

³⁹Jesus said, "For judgment I have come into this world, so that the blind will see and those who see will become blind."



In Other News

1. Special Voters Meeting – On Sunday March 12th, we held a special voters meeting after late service to review a proposed cost addition to the building project. This proposal, which was reviewed by the building committee and Church Council, laid out a complete technology plan for the audio / visual needs of the new building, as well as some important improvements to the existing building. *The voters approved this proposal. 2. **Capital Campaign Update from Corey Schroeder:** The Lord continues to bless St. Paul's. Since the matching gift was announced in December, an additional \$70,520 has been given or pledged, which has a total impact to the campaign of \$105,780. Additionally, we have received the Antioch Foundation (Kwik Trip) grant for \$25,000 which has also been applied towards the matching fund. As a reminder, please be sure to indicate "matching gift" with any new gifts or pledges. We have much to be thankful for indeed. With the Lord's continued blessings, these and other on-going activities will help to reduce the potential mortgage from \$3.1M to the planned \$2.6M.
