
FAMILIES WITH SMALL CHILDREN



As you sent your disciples with the breath of the Spirit, call those in our church full of the Spirit and wisdom to administer the keys of the kingdom.

Wherever we live and whatever we do, help us to be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks us to give the reason for the hope that we have in Christ.

Heavenly Father keep the baptized united with your Son in his resurrection. Put to death the fleshly urges of those caught in addictions, clothe in your righteousness anyone ashamed of good intentions which have fallen short, and assure those searching for purpose that their eternal identity as your dear children is sealed.

Thank you for the power of baptism working in our lives, and for the certainty of its promises through the resurrection. Enrich us with everything we need for life and godliness.





- 9. **Millersville Road Repair** and Paving began Monday April 17. They have torn up most of the road coming from both ways to St. Paul's. It has seemed to work best during the week to come and go by way of Millersville Ave. west of St. Paul's and Warbler Rd. heading north from Millersville Ave. The entire project is slated to be finished (weather permitting) by June.
- 10. **Capital Campaign Update:** The Lord continues to shower St. Paul's with blessings. Since the matching gift was announced in December, an additional \$84,650 has been given or pledged, which has a total impact to the campaign of \$126,975. Work on grant requests has also continued and we were recently notified of a \$50,000 grant that is being gifted to St. Paul's! Additionally, all of the Kohler plumbing products have been received and Neumann plumbing will begin installing them soon. As a reminder, please be sure to indicate "matching gift" with any new gifts or pledges. We have much to be thankful for indeed. With the Lord's continued blessings, these and other on-going activities will help to reduce the potential mortgage from \$3.1M to the planned \$2.6M. Thank you for your continued prayers and support.
- 11. **Save the Dates!** The building expansion is scheduled for completion on August 4. With that date we have planned a dedication date for the facility in our services on **August 13**. We will also install our new teachers [Deb Doletzky and Emily Panzer] that day. Martin Luther College President Rev. Rich Gurgel will serve as our preacher that day. We are also planning an Open House on **August 19**.
- 12. **The gym will be unavailable** starting on Sunday, May 7 through Friday, May 12 for the St. Paul's School Musical.
