A special welcome to our guests and visitors and thank you for joining us!

We at St. Paul's share a common belief that Jesus is our Savior from sin and is the Lord of our lives. Our faith is based on God's Word, which is revealed in the Bible. COMMUNION

We offer Communion on the 2nd and 4th Sundays/Mondays of each month. God says that Communion is an expression of unity (1 Cor.10:16-17), so we practice close communion. Those who have explored and established unity with us on the basis of God's Word are invited up to the Lord's Table. Please speak to a pastor if you have questions about our practice.

FAMILIES WITH SMALL CHILDREN

There are changing tables located in BOTH the women's and men's school bathrooms near the school. There are children's quiet bags in the narthex. If you use one, please make sure to put it back. Please reserve the back few pews for families with small children. We have a nursery room located just off the narthex. There is a speaker in there so you can still hear and take part in the worship service. Please feel free to use this room for your child(ren), including a place to nurse.

St. Paul's Lutheran Church is a member of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (The WELS) and was founded in 1862. We have our Lutheran elementary school (4K-grade 8) on site and are part of a federation of churches to support our own high school, Manitowoc Lutheran High School.

Worship Focus: Most people in our world today have faith. They may have faith in themselves. They may have faith in Allah or Brahman or in a vague higher being they call God. Let everything that has breath praise the LORD.


The LORD who gave life to all nations and desires the salvation of all nations invites us to confess our sins and receive his forgiveness:



First Lesson Genesis 1:1—2:3

God created the heavens and the earth and everything in them; and they were very good.

¹In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. ²Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters.

³And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. ⁴God saw that the light was good, and he separated the light from the darkness. ⁵God called the light "day," and the darkness he called "night." And there was evening, and there was morning—the first day.

⁶And God said, "Let there be a vault between the waters to separate water from water." ⁷So God made the vault and separated the water under the vault from the water above it. And it was so. ⁸God called the vault "sky." And there was evening, and there was morning—the second day.

⁹And God said, "Let the water under the sky be gathered to one place, and let dry ground appear." And it was so. ¹⁰God called the dry ground "land," and the gathered waters he called "seas." And God saw that it was good.

¹¹Then God said, "Let the land produce vegetation: seed-bearing plants and trees on the land that bear fruit with seed in it, according to their various kinds." And it was so. ¹²The land produced vegetation: plants bearing seed according to their kinds and trees bearing fruit with seed in it according to their kinds. And God saw that it was good. ¹³And there was evening, and there was morning—the third day. ¹⁴And God said, "Let there be lights in the vault of the sky to separate the day from the night, and let them serve as signs to mark sacred times, and days and years, ¹⁵and let them be lights in the vault of the sky to give light on the earth." And it was so. ¹⁶God made two great lights—the greater light to govern the day and the lesser light to govern the night. He also made the stars. ¹⁷God set them in the vault of the sky to give light on the earth, ¹⁸to govern the day and the night, and to separate light from darkness. And God saw that it was good. ¹⁹And there was evening, and there was morning—the fourth day.

²⁰And God said, "Let the water teem with living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the vault of the sky." ²¹So God created the great creatures of the sea and every living thing with which the water teems and that moves about in it, according to their kinds, and every winged bird according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. ²²God blessed them and said, "Be fruitful and increase in number and fill the water in the seas, and let the birds increase on the earth." ²³And there was evening, and there was morning—the fifth day.

²⁴And God said, "Let the land produce living creatures according to their kinds: the livestock, the creatures that move along the ground, and the wild animals, each according to its kind." And it was so. ²⁵God made the wild animals according to their kinds, the livestock according to their kinds, and all the creatures that move along the ground according to their kinds. And God saw that it was good. ²⁶Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness, so that they may rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky, over the livestock and all the wild animals, and over all the creatures that move along the ground."

²⁷So God created mankind in his own image,

in the image of God he created them;

male and female he created them.

²⁸God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky and over every living creature that moves on the ground."

²⁹Then God said, "I give you every seed-bearing plant on the face of the whole earth and every tree that has fruit with seed in it. They will be yours for food. ³⁰And to all

the beasts of the earth and all the birds in the sky and all the creatures that move along the ground—everything that has the breath of life in it—I give every green plant for food." And it was so.

³¹God saw all that he had made, and it was very good.

And there was evening, and there was morning—the sixth day.

2 ¹Thus the heavens and the earth were completed in all their vast array.

²By the seventh day God had finished the work he had been doing; so on the seventh day he rested from all his work. ³Then God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work of creating that he had done.





Sermon *2 Corinthians 13*

Rejoice with God's Blessings! Restored - Reunited

Stand

Athanasian Creed

This statement of belief, together with the Apostles' and Nicene creeds, is held in common by all Christian churches. It was written to take a stand on God's Word against false teachings about the triune God and the person of Jesus Christ. Although it was not written by Athanasius, it is named after this defender of God's truth who lived in the 300s AD. We humans cannot comprehend the fullness of God. But since he is our Lord and Savior and means everything to us, we want to honor his name and what he tells us about himself in the Scriptures.

- ¹ Whoever wishes to be saved must, above all else, hold to the true Christian faith.
- ² Whoever does not keep this faith pure in all points will certainly perish forever.
- ³ Now this is the true Christian faith:
- ⁴ We worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity, without mixing the persons or dividing the divine being.
- ⁵ For each person—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—is distinct,

- ⁶ but the deity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory and coeternal in majesty.
- ⁷ What the Father is, so is the Son, and so is the Holy Spirit.
- ⁸ The Father is uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated;
- ⁹ the Father is infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite;
- ¹⁰ the Father is eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal;
- 11 yet they are not three who are eternal, but there is one who is eternal,
- ¹² just as they are not three who are uncreated, nor three who are infinite, but there is one who is uncreated and one who is infinite.
- ¹³ In the same way the Father is almighty, the Son is almighty, the Holy Spirit is almighty;
- ¹⁴ yet they are not three who are almighty, but there is one who is almighty.
- ¹⁵ So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God;
- ¹⁶ yet they are not three Gods, but one God.
- ¹⁷ So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord;
- ¹⁸ yet they are not three Lords, but one Lord.
- ¹⁹ For just as Christian truth compels us to confess each person individually to be God and Lord, so the true Christian faith forbids us to speak of three Gods or three Lords.
- ²⁰ The Father is neither made nor created nor begotten of anyone.
- ²¹ The Son is neither made nor created, but is begotten of the Father alone.
- ²² The Holy Spirit is neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeds from the Father and the Son.
- ²³ So there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.
- ²⁴ And within this Trinity none comes before or after; none is greater or inferior;
- ²⁵ but all three persons are coequal and coeternal, so that in every way, as stated before, the Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity is to be worshiped.
- ²⁶ Whoever wishes to be saved must have this conviction of the Trinity.

In the bright new hope of your resurrection teach us to offer our lives in praise to God and love to our neighbor.

Creator Spirit, you breathed into us new life by the power of the gospel, opened our eyes to see the light of your grace, and filled our minds with the clear sound of your voice. Through Word and sacrament lead us to understand more completely how broad and deep and high is the love of God in Christ Jesus. Firm up our resolve to do battle with Satan and sin.


In every weakness be our strength, that we may show ourselves to be God's children: faithful in prayer, constant in hope, and fervent in love.







- 11. New Church Furniture You may notice a new piece of furniture on the baptismal font side of church. For years members have struggled to pass between the piano as they returned to their seats from communion. Musicians also haven't had enough room for their instruments/music stands. The elders wanted to address these concerns in a way that minimally impacts seating. The front pew on that side has always been a place for instrumentalists to set their instruments and for other worship supplies to be kept. It is not often used for seating. This new piece of furniture, replacing the front pew, is shorter than the standard pew to allow more room for worshipers to return to their seats. It is also tall enough to block any unsightly music stands and microphones, which up till now have been cluttering the sacristy. There is storage to hold choir music, choir folders, and pianists' music. A drawer on the aisle side holds the hand held microphones that are used for announcements. A handrail provides support for worshipers to stand. While the piece is beautiful and blends in well with the other church furnishings, there was a small error in construction. They forgot to include a toe kick, providing room for worshipers in the pew behind to rest their feet. The company hopes to have it replaced by the end of summer. It may take a while to grow accustomed to it, but we're sure it will soon feel like this new piece of furniture was always meant to be in our worship space.
- 12. **Update from Corey Schroeder:** The Lord continues to shower St. Paul's with blessings. Since the matching gift was announced in December, an additional \$125,100 (as of 5/30) has been given or pledged, which has a total impact to the campaign of \$187,650! As a reminder, the matching gift remains open until construction is completed, or until a total of \$130,000 is given or pledged against it. Please be sure to indicate "matching gift" with any new gifts or pledges. We have much to be thankful for indeed.
