#### THE THEME OF OUR WORSHIP:

The Need for Followership: powerful allies. Green Berets. Rangers. SEALs. Delta Force. These special forces groups are part of the United States military. They are elite: highly trained with unique skill sets. Many of their important missions are carried out in total secrecy. Two weeks ago...we acknowledged that we are in the middle of a massive spiritual war. Today, we thank God that we fight this war with the protection of special forces. Since the fifth century...Christians have observed the Festival of St. Michael and All Angels. We commemorate that God has sent Michael...one of the great archangels described in Scripture...and countless of his fellow angels to protect and serve mankind. Let us rejoice that followers of Christ have powerful allies!

**WELCOME!** Thank you for joining us for worship on this morning. At St. Paul's, you will find a worship service designed to praise God and increase people's faith. While all styles of worship take some getting used to, we hope you will find that the main message – the unconditional love Jesus has for us – comes through clearly.

**PARTICIPATE.** Many parts of our worship service are interactive. Feel free to sing along with the hymns and songs. There are also times in the service when Pastor and congregation speak back and forth. Please join together as you feel comfortable.

**PARAMENTS.** In Lutheran churches you often see paraments. These are the colored cloths with symbols on them hanging from the altar and pulpit. They change with the church seasons and celebrations as a visual reminder of what we are celebrating in our worship. White is the color of purity and completeness...a perfect color for servants of God – the angels. In addition to its use during the season of Easter...white is the appointed color for such festive Sundays as Christmas; Epiphany and the Baptism of Our Lord; Transfiguration Sunday; and today – Michael and All Angels.

**PERSONAL CONVENIENCES.** For your convenience, restrooms are located down the hall to the right of the entrance into the sanctuary...feel free to ask for directions. Cell phones should be turned off or put on vibrate mode so as not to disrupt others during the service. Thank you for your cooperation.

To help you focus while you join us for worship, take the time to eliminate as many distractions around you as possible. While we share the promises of God's Word with you, we encourage you to create community. Use the comment and chat areas to let others know you are worshipping with them. We may be separated by in-person or livestream worship, but we can connect with each other here for Christian support and encouragement.

## THE FESTIVAL OF MICHAEL & ALL ANGELS

The Church is guarded/protected by angels. We know one of them is named Michael. Michael is one of two angels that the Bible names for us. The other is the great messenger of God's grace...Gabriel. Gabriel's job was to announce the remarkable works of God's salvation to the waiting world. Michael's job is different.

Michael is called the archangel...that is, the leader of the angels. The Bible says that he is in charge of the great army of angels that God uses to protect and care for us. This is the day we remember God's great love in giving us these amazing protectors...the angels.

For 1500 years the Christian Church has celebrated The Festival of St. Michael & All Angels near the autumnal equinox...the day of 12 hours of sunlight

and 12 hours of darkness. As Christians watched the autumn nights grow longer and the days grow shorter...they were reminded of the struggle between good and evil – between the forces of light and the forces of darkness – between the angel armies of God and the demonic forces of Satan. And so...every year as autumn darkened into



winter...the Church celebrated the Feast of the Archangel, and remembered that Michael and All the Angels fought on their side.

You see...angels are one of God's answers to your fears. God wants to give you proper perspective as you go through this life. No matter what sounds you hear...or dilemmas you face...or tragedies you endure...God's message for you is: Don't be afraid, because you are not alone.

Hymn Appreciation: Rev. Peter Prange...the author of this hymn...writes this: "I could find no hymn that properly surveyed the scriptural truths of this important festival (not even a mention of St. Michael!), so I decided to write one myself. As you can see, the scriptural allusions are many in this hymn that recounts the cosmic struggle between the devil, the Lord, and their angels." The bold text and tune suggest that the hymn be played in a majestic style...with the feeling of a march.

Hymn Appreciation: This hymn was written by Philip Melanchthon...one of the heroes of the Lutheran Reformation. Melanchthon was a child prodigy and graduated from the University of Heidelberg at age 14. By age 21 he was appointed professor of Greek language and literature at the University of Wittenberg...where Dr. Martin Luther served as an Old Testament professor. Melanchthon was an extremely popular lecturer...at times addressing 500 to 1500 students. Guided by Luther, he wrote the Augsburg Confession in 1530...a monumental contribution to Lutheranism. After his death, he was buried in the Castle Church in Wittenberg...opposite Luther's pulpit-side grave. Lord God, to You We Give All Praise was written in 1543. Melanchthon wanted his people to have a hymn which portrayed angels in their proper, biblical duties: not as something you would pray to (which the Catholic Church of the day was teaching)...but as creatures sent by God to serve and protect mankind.
