THE THEME OF OUR WORSHIP:

The Need for Followership: When the bathroom is all steamy after the morning shower, it can be impossible to see yourself in the mirror to get ready for the day – and then embarrassing to go about your day not knowing what you look like. It is even worse to go through life blind to God – it is deadly. Today's worship is about seeing ourselves and our complete dependence on God clearly. Then we go about each day by Spirit-worked and gospel-powered faith looking to Jesus. The steam scatters and we follow him, "Seeing the Lord by Faith".

WELCOME! Thank you for joining us for worship this morning. At St. Paul's, you will find a worship service designed to praise God and increase people's faith. While all styles of worship take some getting used to, we hope you will find that the main message – the unconditional love Jesus has for us – comes through clearly.

PARTICIPATE. Many parts of our worship service are interactive. Feel free to sing along with the hymns and songs. There are also times in the service when Pastor and congregation speak back and forth. Please join together as you feel comfortable.

PARAMENTS. In Lutheran churches you often see paraments. These are the colored cloths with symbols on them hanging from the altar and pulpit. They change with the church seasons and celebrations as a visual reminder of what we are celebrating in our worship. Green is the color of life and nourishment...the basic color of nature. After reliving the great events of the life of Christ...the worshipping Church spends half a year focusing on the teachings of Christ. The Church wears green during the season of Pentecost as the Spirit uses those teachings of Jesus to grow the faith of believers.

PERSONAL CONVENIENCES. For your convenience, restrooms are located in the southwest corner of the narthex across from the entrance into the sanctuary...feel free to ask for directions. Cell phones should be turned off or put on vibrate mode so as not to disrupt others during the service. Thank you for your cooperation.

THE SEASON OF PENTECOST

The Sundays after Pentecost comprise the longest season of the Church Year. After spending a half-year looking at Christ's life *for* us...we now spend a half-year looking at Christ's life *in* us. By the power of the Spirit working through the Word and Sacraments...Christ produces spiritual growth within us. That growth is symbolized by the green colors that drape the church for much of this season.

LORD, HAVE MERCY

Kyrie

Liturgy appreciation: Prayer often introduced Old Testament worship, and the early Christians continued the custom of beginning their gathering with a responsive prayer. As we gather around God's Word, we seek the Lord's mercy: though we sinners deserve only punishment, we ask that the Lord would instead spare us and provide for us in our great need. This was the prayer of the ten lepers, the Canaanite woman, blind men, and of God's people still today.

Kyrie (KEE-ree-ay) is Greek for Lord and *Gloria in excelsis* is Latin for Glory in the highest. The ancient titles remind us that Christians have sung these songs for centuries in countless musical settings. These two song texts and three others are from a set of songs called the Ordinary. The words of these five songs repeat the most important teachings of the gospel, and that's why we often use them still.

Glory Be to God on High combines three ancient hymns. You'll recognize the first as the song the angels sang on the fields of Bethlehem. This hymn proclaims Jesus Christ as the center of God's plan to save the world. We sing it often because it is worth remembering and memorizing.







Jesus showed the church in Laodicea how poor, naked, and blind they were; only by faith in him could they be rich, clothed, and able to see.

¹⁴"To the angel of the church in Laodicea write:

These are the words of the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the ruler of God's creation. ¹⁵I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either one or the other! ¹⁶So, because you are lukewarm—neither hot nor cold—I am about to spit you out of my mouth. ¹⁷You say, 'I am rich; I have acquired wealth and do not need a thing.' But you do not realize that you are wretched, pitiful, poor, blind and naked. ¹⁸I counsel you to buy from me gold refined in the fire, so you can become rich; and white clothes to wear, so you can cover your shameful nakedness; and salve to put on your eyes, so you can see.

¹⁹Those whom I love I rebuke and discipline. So be earnest and repent. ²⁰Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me.



⁵²"Go," said Jesus, "your faith has healed you." Immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus along the road.







Hymn Appreciation: One of the most well-known hymns in the world, "Amazing Grace" was written by John Newton, a slave trader and sea captain who knew well both sin and grace. Brought to faith by God...John Newton left that world behind and served as a pastor for 35 years. His grave marker in an England cemetery is engraved with words he wrote himself: John Newton, clerk, once an Infidel and Libertine, a servant of slavers in Africa, was, by the rich Mercy of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, preserved, restored, pardoned, and appointed to preach the Faith he had long labored to destroy.
