COMMUNION



Those who have explored and established unity with us on the basis of God's Word are invited up to the Lord's Table. Please speak to a pastor if you have questions about our practice.

#### FAMILIES WITH SMALL CHILDREN

There are changing tables located in BOTH the women's and men's school bathrooms near the school. There are children's quiet bags in the narthex. If you use one, please make sure to put it back. Please reserve the back few pews for families with small children. We have a nursery room located just off the narthex. There is a speaker in there so you can still hear and take part in the worship service. Please feel free to use this room for your child(ren), including a place to nurse.

St. Paul's Lutheran Church is a member of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (The WELS) and was founded in 1862. We have our Lutheran elementary school (3K-grade 8) on site and are part of a federation of churches to support our own high school, Manitowoc Lutheran High School.



Jesus is our Good Shepherd who knows his sheep, lays down his life for them, and gathers other sheep as well.





#### **Grow with Christ**

#### Bible Studies, Worship, and more!

- 1. **Adult Bible Study -** You are invited to join us for a 4 week Bible study series (4/21,28; 5/12,19) where we will delve into the fascinating journey following the footsteps of the apostle Paul in Greece. Recently, a group from St. Paul's embarked on a trip to explore the culture, geography, and history of the places he visited, and Staff Minister Luther Curia is eager to share our discoveries with you. During our trip, we traced Paul's mission work, visiting key locations such as Athens, Corinth, and Thessalonica. We learned about the rich cultural tapestry of these ancient cities and gained a deeper understanding of the challenges and triumphs Paul experienced in spreading the gospel. Join us as we unravel the layers of history and delve into the significance of Paul's mission in Greece. Whether you are a seasoned Bible scholar or simply curious about this pivotal chapter in Christian history, there will be something for everyone to learn and discuss.
- 2. **Wednesday Bible Study** This month we began our study of 1 Thessalonians. There have been great applications for regular prayer life, faith going into action, willingness to labor out of love, and holding onto hope to endure through difficult times. Come and be encouraged as we continue through this letter that helps us stand firm in the faith.
- 3. **Confirmation -** On the first weekend of May, 13 young people will be confirmed in the faith at St. Paul's. God says that a person should be able to examine himself before taking communion. The examination service on Saturday, May 4 at 1:00 pm will allow the congregation to see that the confirmands are prepared to do this. This service is also a helpful review of the chief parts of the catechism. Here is the schedule for Sunday, May 5: regular worship services at 8:00 and 9:30 am, Confirmation worship service at 11:00 am with first communion for the confirmands. There will be Sunday School at the normal time, from 9:15-10:15; there will not be Adult Bible Class on May 5.
- 4. **Ascension -** On Thursday, May 9, at 6:30 pm, we will join with members from St. John / St. Peter (SJSP) and Calvary for our Ascension service. It will be held at SJSP in Cleveland. Musicians from all the churches will participate, as well as joint children's and adult choirs. Come and worship the Lord together with our brothers and sisters in the faith!
