

Please reserve the back few pews for families with small children. We have a nursery room located just off the narthex. There is a speaker in there so you can still hear and take part in the worship service. Please feel free to use this room for your child(ren), including a place to nurse.

St. Paul's Lutheran Church is a member of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (The WELS) and was founded in 1862. We have our Lutheran elementary school (3K-grade 8) on site and are part of a federation of churches to support our own high school, Manitowoc Lutheran High School.



Malachi 3:8–12


The LORD promised to exceed the Israelite's expectations in blessing those who were devoted to him. 8"Will a mere mortal rob God? Yet you rob me.



Help us to balance our duty to give with the joy of giving.



In Other News

- 1. **New Called Worker Welcome Items -** The Care Committee for Called Workers (CCCW) would like to welcome Pastor Pechman and Jennifer Hacker and their families with a pantry / scrip shower. Congregation members are welcome to place paper products, cleaning products, or canned goods in the labeled box by the kiosk in the Narthex. There is also an envelope box for scrip or monetary gifts. These items will be divided and given to the Pechmans and Hackers this summer. Please bring donated items by early July.
- 2. **Northern Wisconsin District (NWD) Convention -** As a congregation of the NWD of the WELS, our male called workers and a lay delegate, Will Belitz, were in Appleton for the biennial convention on June 11-12. We learned about many exciting things

happening with Home Missions. In the 10 years leading up to 2033, we hope under the Lord's blessing to establish 100 new home missions. In 2023-2024, there have been 15 new starts, including Kronenwetter, WI, and Anchor Church in Marquette, MI. There have also been 17 mission enhancements to established congregations in these first two years of the program, including Good Shepherd in Plymouth. You can learn more at wels100in10.net. In our own NWD, there is Hispanic outreach going on from Menasha to Green Bay and in Greenleaf / Morrison, as well as Hmong ministry in Manitowoc.
