COMMUNION

We offer Communion on the 2nd and 4th Sundays/Mondays of each month. God says that Communion is an expression of unity (1 Cor.10:16-17), so we practice close communion. Those who have explored and established unity with us on the basis of God's Word are invited up to the Lord's Table . Please speak to a pastor if you have questions about our practice.

Please reserve the back few pews for families with small children. We have a nursery room located just off the narthex. There is a speaker in there so you can still hear and take part in the worship service. Please feel free to use this room for your child(ren), including a place to nurse.



St. Paul's Lutheran Church is a member of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (The WELS) and was founded in 1862. We have our Lutheran elementary school (4K-grade 8) on site and are part of a federation of churches to support our own high school, Manitowoc Lutheran High School.

Today's Worship Focus: *Ever since humans separated themselves from God in the Garden of Eden, there has been division. The LORD said there would be enmity between those who followed Eve's faith and the devil's rebellion. This division has continued in every generation. Some follow their own will, others follow the LORD's Word. Where his Word is proclaimed, the distinction is sharp, and the tension deep. Yet ultimately he disciplines, purifies and blesses his people, even when here on earth "The Lord's Word Brings Division".*





- 1. SAVE THE DATE** - St. Paul's will celebrate its 160th anniversary on September 18th in both Sunday services. We have lined up Rev. Tom Unke (our former pastor) to preach that day. There will be a light breakfast served between services with historical displays. After the late service, we will enjoy a meal and fellowship. More details to come!
- 2. Did You Know?** 2022 marks the 160th anniversary of our St. Paul's congregation! In commemoration of this memorable milestone for our church, we will be sharing interesting facts about our church's history in each week's bulletin until a special anniversary service in fall. In October of 1931 the Senior Choir, now St. Paul's Adult Choir, was formed. The role of the choir is meaningful and very

much in keeping with confessional Lutheranism. Prior to Martin Luther's time, the congregation did not participate in singing; the choir was an "official" and elite arm of the church's leadership. The Reformation changed that, however, and besides encouraging all people to read the Scriptures also encouraged all believers to sing—and not in Latin but in their own common language! A radical change! The first people's hymnal of 1524 had eight hymns in it, and because the printed word was expensive in those times, that hymnal first went to the church choir—but only so the choir could teach the hymns to the congregation. At St. Paul's, the choir may introduce a new hymn to the congregation, highlight the season of the church year or the Scripture readings with a special anthem, or enrich the liturgy by taking an active part in the responses. We have no desire to entertain or to take on the role of a "show choir." We seek only to encourage the congregation in worship so that all glory goes to God. Our choir will be starting up again soon! More information can be found below.

3. **New Sunday Bible Study:** Last weekend, we began a new study called Anniversary Reflections. We are looking at portions of Acts to reflect on the beginnings, struggles, purpose, and confidence Christian churches have under their ascended Lord Jesus. We are considering the history of our synod and our congregation as we prepare to celebrate St. Paul's 160th anniversary in September. Our Summer Sunday morning studies are geared for adults on down to about 3rd graders. Childcare is available for the younger ones.
4. **Financial Class - \$42,740.** Last time we held this class, we totaled up the combined debt paid off. And that was the amount after 9 weeks. All because of the disciplined and intentional approach of the program called "Financial Peace University". The Lord asks us to be wise managers of all he has entrusted to us. Whether you are struggling to keep up with bills or just want to be more organized, this class and the mutual encouragement offered will make a difference, so that you can be faithful with your money and rich toward God. We will meet on Tuesdays from 6:00-8:00, beginning September 6. The cost of the program will quickly pay for itself. 5. **Sunday School -** The theme for Sunday School this year is "Built on the Rock". Classes begin on September 11 between services. For planning this wonderful

6. **Adult Choir Coming Soon!** Do you have a love of singing and a love for your Savior? If so, consider joining our St. Paul's Adult Choir! It is open to all high school age students and up. We meet Monday nights from 7:00-8:00. Our first rehearsal will be Monday, September 12. You don't have to have a solo voice or be able to read notes like a pro! We'd love to have you! Childcare is available if needed (provided by the Curia children). In order to help with music selections, please indicate ON THIS FORM which voice part(s) you generally sing. If you don't know, just think: Soprano (higher female voice), Alto (lower female voice), Tenor (higher male voice), Bass (lower male voice). 7. **Pastors Helping Plymouth** - Our circuit pastor, Pastor Ted Olsen, from Zion in Louis Corners, is helping Good Shepherd in Plymouth organize for ministry moving forward since Pastor Heup was called to heaven. Pastor Bode and Pastor Mueller are involved in a rotation to help to cover worship services this month. Pastor Bode will be preaching at Zion in Louis Corners this morning and at Good Shepherd next weekend.
8. **Sunday Morning Child Care** is offered in the preschool room during Family Bible Hour. Since the summer Bible class is geared for adults all the way down to about 3rd graders, children younger than that can be brought to child care during that time.
9. **St Paul's After School Care** - We are looking for after school care help for the 2022-2023 school year. Hours are Monday through Friday from 3:30-5:30pm. spend an evening together playing games, enjoying music and God's Word, sharing in small group discussions and just having fun and fellowship together.
