Q & A with Mr. Marohn about our Kindergarten Vacancy/Call - At the direction of the Board of Education, St. Paul’s has placed a request with our synod for a graduate from Martin Luther College (MLC) to fill our kindergarten teaching position.

When is assignment day for MLC graduates?

- Assignment day at MLC is Saturday, May 18th. This is the day we will learn if we have been assigned a graduate or not.

What does it mean to have a new teacher?

- New teachers are full of energy and new ideas. They are eager to serve and share Jesus with others.
- It is true that experience is valuable. However, all teachers begin their ministry this way, with a first year of teaching.
- St. Paul’s has a terrific staff for mentoring new teachers. The congregation is also ideal for a teacher new to the ministry. We have outstanding pastoral leadership and lay member support.
- Martin Luther College assigns all first-year teachers a trained mentor from a nearby school. This program is called the New Teacher Induction program.
- Martin Luther College is an excellent school that has been recognized as a top tier training school for education. Martin Luther College is the recipient of many awards and accolades. Just recently, MLC was again ranked as one of the top schools in the country by Money Magazine.

Are we guaranteed to be assigned a graduate?

- No. Right now our synod is in great need of educators. There are over 200 positions throughout the synod in need of a teacher.

Who decides if we receive an assignment?

- Our District President will place graduates with consideration to requests and greatest needs throughout the district.

What is the plan if we don't receive a graduate?

- If St. Paul's does not receive an assignment, we would likely place one more call before the call window closes.
