

CHRIST LIGHT CONNECTION

So that the Israelites would not suffer from the tenth plague, they were told to take a lamb from their flocks - the best lamb, a male without blemish or spot, a perfect specimen — one lamb for each family. After the ceremonial law was given, poor families could substitute a lamb for a pair of doves as a sacrifice. Not so with the Passover, though. Instead, poor families – or families too small to eat an entire lamb – were to join with another family. But, a lamb was required. After killing the lamb, they were to collect the blood, so they could spread it above and around the door to their homes.

God gave the reasoning: "On that same night I will pass through Egypt and strike down every firstborn of both people and animals, and will bring judgment on all the gods of Egypt. I am the Lord. The blood will be a sign for you on the houses where you are, and when I see the blood, I will pass over you. No destructive plague will touch you when I strike Egypt." The blood of the lamb would save them from the plague of death.



The Old Testament covenant of the Passover is now fulfilled and replaced by the New Testament Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. The blood of thousands upon thousands of lambs reaches its fulfillment, replaced by the blood of one Lamb who takes away the sin of the whole world, Jesus Christ. Jesus is our Passover Lamb - our Savior! He has washed our sins away. We no longer fear death as heaven is our through the Lamb of God - Jesus.

WISCONSIN PARENTAL CHOICE PROGRAM

St. Paul's Lutheran School is in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP). This is a program designed to assist families who desire private schooling for their children and meet residency and income requirements. Families who meet income and residency requirements are eligible to receive a tuition voucher from the state to attend St. Paul's Lutheran School.

Any student entering 4K, Kindergarten, or 1st grade is eligible to apply through the WPCP. Students transferring in from the public school system, out of state, or a homeschool education, may apply at any grade level.

The window for applications opens on February 3rd and remains open until April 16th. However, now is the time to gather information. BIBLE INFORMATION CLASS


Sundays - Beginning January 10th
