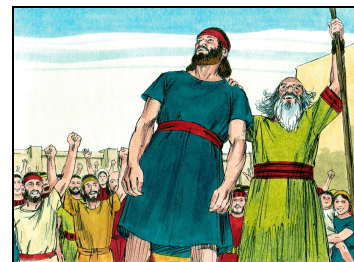


CHRIST LIGHT CONNECTION

The Israelites must have felt so different than the peoples around them. Instead of focusing on the privileges and protection they received when they were living in obedience to God's laws, they focused on wanting to look like the unbelieving people in other cities. This disappointed Samuel. God reminded Samuel that it wasn't him the people were rejecting . . . but God himself. Saul was anointed as Israel's first king.

Do you ever feel like that? When are times that you are embarrassed to be different than others around you? It's not always easy to be "different" but we honor God when we are obedient to Him. Our obedience to Him brings protection from evil and blessing in our lives. Our obedience to God causes others to see Jesus more clearly than acting like unbelievers.

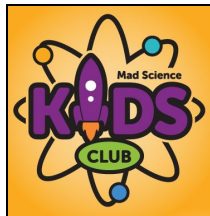
